

Start earning and learning today.

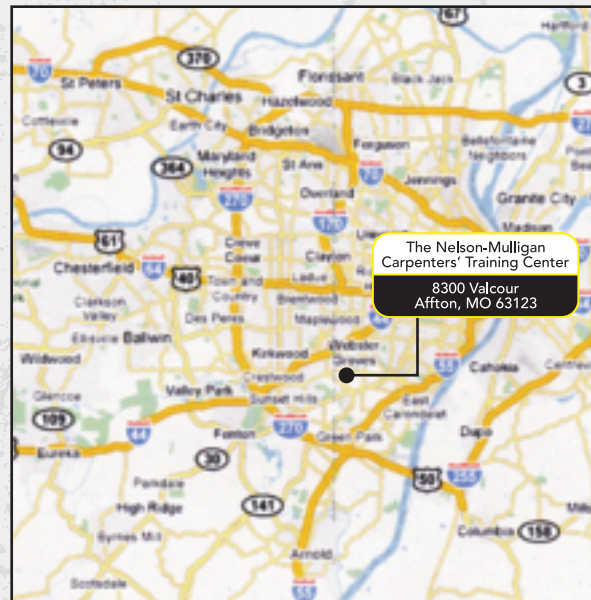
The Apprentice Program has 10 terms. During each term, you will continue to work with your Union Contractor and also attend classes to complete your "training units." Each term requires that you work 800 hours on the job and complete two units at the Training School.

Your salary will increase as you move to each new level. After you have worked 8,000 hours and have completed 20 units of training, you will graduate from the Joint Apprenticeship Program. Now you are a Journey-Level Electrician.

You will be required to attend day classes approximately twice a year. These day classes are given in 10-day sessions; you will be in school eight hours each day. The day classes are a combination of classroom and hands-on shop training. Prior to the six-month anniversary date of your indenture you must meet Required Math and Literacy Competencies. Prior to the one-year anniversary date of Indenture you must acquire a GED or High School Diploma.

Upon reaching Journey-Level status, credits toward an Associates of Applied Science Degree are awarded at many of the region's community colleges. A college degree can enhance your technical skills, which may result in more diverse career opportunities.

Come to The Nelson-Mulligan Carpenters' Training Center located at 8300 Valcour Avenue between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday through Friday (except holidays).

- Show proof that you are at least 18 years old (photo I.D.).
- Fill out an application.
- Begin looking for an Apprenticeship Job with a Union Contractor. We have Employment Counselors available to assist you.

Become an Apprentice Electrician

After you have found a job come back to The Nelson-Mulligan Carpenters' Training Center and do the following.

- Bring us a letter of intent from a Union Contractor saying they intend to hire you as an Apprentice Electrician.
- Take and pass an approved drug test.
- Register for the next available orientation course.
